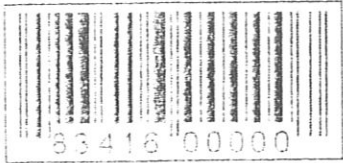

Mayor appoints two new CAA board members

Mayor Mark Mallory has appointed two new members and re-appointed a third member from City Hall to serve on the board of the Cincinnati-Hamilton Community Action Agency (CAA).

Board members set, interpret and enforce the policy of CAA. In addition, they advise and make decisions on fiscal and other matters pertaining to the agency.

The Community Action Agency is a non-profit private social service agency and operates federally funded programs that assist low- to moderate-income residents in Hamilton County. The agency serves nearly 25,000 children and families annually and

has a \$35 million operating budget. The agency administers Head Start, an early childhood educational program that serves more than 4000 low-income preschoolers in Hamilton County. Other CAA services are community and economic development, emergency rental and mortgage assistance, job-readiness skills training, utility payment assistance and weatherization - a program that makes home improvements designed to save energy and reduce clients' heating bills.
