COVID-19 VACCINES OFFERED AT CINCINNATI CAA

Cincinnati CAA and WinMed Health Services Offer COVID-19 Vaccine April 7 and 8

[Cincinnati, Ohio] April 6, 2021 – The Community Action Agency of Cincinnati and Hamilton County, WinMed Health Services and the Ohio National Guard are teaming up to help make COVID-19 vaccines available to the community, with first-dose appointments set for Wednesday and Thursday, April 7 and 8 at the CAA headquarters, 1740 Langdon Farm Road, 9:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

Important note: A second dose of the vaccine will be administered the following month, May 5 and 6, 9:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

“We are committed to helping stop the spread of the coronavirus and keeping families safe and healthy,” explains Mark B. Lawson, Cincinnati CAA president and CEO. “This partnership evolved quickly to provide an accessible and convenient option for our community, and we hope to see many of our neighbors taking advantage of this service.”
